Alana is a stone from the west of Boyacá, Colombia whose origin is a hydrothermal vein that comes from the “Muzo” fault with a formation of more than sixty million years (60,000,000), its components are emerald, quartz, calcite, shale carbonaceous, iron oxides and sedimentary and metamorphic rocks in the mother stone among other minerals, its vivid green color highlights the wonders of nature due to the origin of its formation, it stands out for its rare beauty and its complex gemological formation. A 100% natural specimen, it weighs 25 kilos, it is a beta pocket, approximately it has more or less 900 carats in emerald, possibly its interior contains more emeralds.

Allow me to attach the certificate of origin which I understand has not been given to you until now and three (3) more certificates,



one Colombian with a gemologist who studied at the GIA, the second certificate is from the gemological laboratory of the municipality of Dubai with all the ISO requirements and the third report, together with a commercial appraisal, is carried out and signed by a GIA gemologist who works for an American firm whose certification and expertise is signed by said organization.

In any case, I would like to highlight that as per the evidence in our possession there are at least 1000 carats of emerald in the geode.

If we are following the actual Emeralds market price.

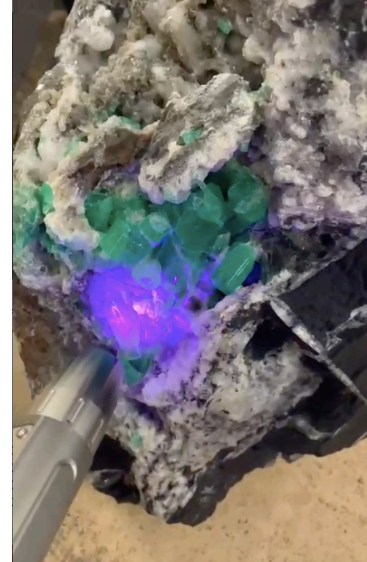
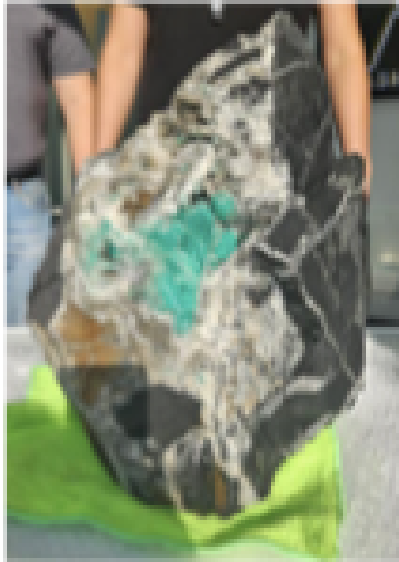
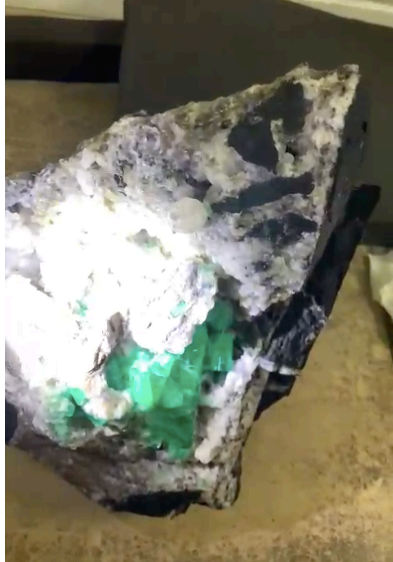
I don't think this point can be questioned.
